1	Kansas City Chiefs	RB Kareem Hunt is already 113 yards clear of the NFL's next closest rusher.
2	Atlanta Falcons	Calvin Johnson was not impressed by the Golden Tate TD reversal.
3	New England Patriots	QB Tom Brady has thrown for 825 yards and eight TDs with no interceptions in his last two games.
4	Minnesota Vikings	QB Sam Bradford's status is the dominant storyline for a second straight week. Case Keenum can't keep this up.
5	Denver Broncos	The Broncos turned the ball over on their final 4 possessions against Buffalo with 2 interceptions & 2 fourth-down stops.
6	Green Bay Packers	An OT home win over Cincinnati was not impressive, but in Week 3 wins were hard to come by for good teams.
7	Washington Redskins	We cringed when we elevated the Redskins this high, but the NFL's pecking order is always murky early in the season.
8	Detroit Lions	If only Matthew Stafford had had one more play against Atlanta to engineer more fourth-quarter magic.
9	Oakland Raiders	A cross-country flight to D.C. probably precipitated a flat performance, but concerns about the Raiders defense are back.
10	Pittsburgh Steelers	Ugly loss to the Bears. Too many stunts and slants at the line to stop Jordan Bell.
11	Philadelphia Eagles	Jake Elliott's 61-yard FG was the longest game-winner in NFL history for a rookie and also a franchise record.
12	Dallas Cowboys	DE Demarcus Lawrence is the guy who doesn't need reservations for a spot in opponents' backfield.
13	Tennessee Titans	Tennessee scored at least 30 points for a second straight week.
14	Jacksonville Jaguars	The Jaguars have played five games on London. Maybe it's time relocate?
15	Buffalo Bills	Apparently, the Bills can win without LeSean McCoy carrying the load.
16	Baltimore Ravens	The Jaguars' 44-7 win was the Ravens' worst defeat since Nov. 9, 1997, when they lost 37-0 at Pittsburgh.
17	Carolina Panthers	Carolina had allowed six points in its previous two games. Naturally, it allowed 34 to the previously winless Saints.
18	Los Angeles Rams	The Rams' two wins are over Indianapolis and San Francisco, but this offense is intriguing.
19	Tampa Bay Buccaneers	Jameis Winston threw two interceptions in the end zone and three total against the Vikings.
20	Seattle Seahawks	DeMarco Murray's 75-yard TD run was the longest against Seattle since Frank Gore's 80-yarder in 2009, pre-Pete Carroll.
21	Houston Texans	Jadeveon Clowney is the third player in Texans history with two sacks and a fumble return for a TD in a game.
22	Miami Dolphins	Miami was 1 for 12 on third downs against the Jets, and failed to convert on its first eight opportunities.
23	Arizona Cardinals	Once elite tackle Jared Veldheer and guard Evan Boehm look utterly lost on the right side of Arizona's line.
24	New Orleans Saints	QB Drew Brees has thrown for 1,252 yards and 12 TDs with three interceptions in his last four games against the Panthers.
25	Chicago Bears	The Bears are 13-1 all-time at home against the Steelers. Weird.
26	New York Jets	QB Josh McCown granted coach Todd Bowles a stay of execution.
27	Indianapolis Colts	At least we know the Colts aren't tanking for Andrew Luck.
28	New York Giants	QB Eli Manning threw 3 TD passes in the 4th quarter at Philadelphia. New York hadn't scored 20 points in 8 straight games.
29	Cincinnati Bengals	The Bengals are 0-3 for the first time since 2008.
30	Los Angeles Chargers	Philip Rivers (3 picks Sunday) led the NFL in interceptions two of the last three seasons, including last year's career-high 21.
31	San Francisco 49ers	San Francisco has lost 17 of its last 18 games.
32	Cleveland Browns	It's settled. Cleveland is still the worst team in the NFL.
