1	Kansas City Chiefs	According to Pro Football Reference, the Chiefs have beaten the 3rd, 4th, 5th, and 6th best teams in the NFL.
2	Carolina Panthers	Cam Newton's sexist comments to a female reporter are a reminder of how hard it is to be a woman covering pro sports.
3	Green Bay Packers	Davante Adams caught the winning TD just 10 days after leaving the field on a stretcher following a helmet-to-helmet hit.
4	Philadelphia Eagles	The Eagles entered with the NFL's second-best third-down offense and converted their 1st four chances against the Cards.
5	Atlanta Falcons	The Falcons host the Dolphins coming out of their bye week before a Super Bowl rematch with the Patriots in New England.
6	Denver Broncos	The Broncos are allowing an NFL-low 50.8 rushing yards per game.
7	New England Patriots	QB Tom Brady tied Brett Favre's and Peyton Manning's NFL record for regular season wins with No. 186 against Tampa Bay.
8	Detroit Lions	QB Matthew Stafford's regular fourth-quarter magic fell just short vs. Carolina, but he did throw two late TDs.
9	Seattle Seahawks	Seattle made a statement with a win over the Rams in L.A. The Seahawks are still the team to beat in the NFC West.
10	Washington Redskins	Redskins CB Josh Norman is donating \$100,000 to help Puerto Rico as it recovers from Hurricane Maria.
11	Buffalo Bills	It was so Buffalo to lose to Cincinnati after beating Carolina, Denver and Atlanta.
12	Baltimore Ravens	The Ravens had 3 pass plays of 20-plus yards in their first 4 games. Joe Flacco and Mike Wallace connected on 3 in Oakland.
13	Pittsburgh Steelers	Ben Roethlisberger's career-high 5 INTs were the most by a Pittsburgh QB since Mark Malone threw 5 vs Cleveland in 1987.
14	Los Angeles Rams	Five turnovers and a late, dropped pass in the end zone kept L.A. from seizing control of the NFC West.
15	Minnesota Vikings	The Vikings will need a healthy Sam Bradford to make noise, but they're doing a fine job of staying afloat without him.
16	Miami Dolphins	Jay Cutler's unpopularity index in Miami is approaching his score in Chicago -- even after a win.
17	Jacksonville Jaguars	Jacksonville beat the Steelers for the first time in a decade.
18	New Orleans Saints	RB Adrian Peterson had played in just 42 offensive snaps, fewer than the Saints' kicker. The Cards will offer more.
19	Tampa Bay Buccaneers	K Nick Folk sealed his fate with three key misses against New England. Now he's looking for a job.
20	Oakland Raiders	QB Derek Carr's return timeline will determine whether Oakland makes the playoffs.
21	Dallas Cowboys	The Cowboys are allowing 26.4 points per game, the fourth-worst mark in the NFL.
22	Houston Texans	J.J. Watt just can't catch a break -- pun definitely not intended.
23	Tennessee Titans	Marcus Mariota's injury replacement, Matt Cassel went 21 for 32 for 141 yards and was sacked six times.
24	New York Jets	Coach Todd Bowles is making the most of little talent, but New York's wins are against Miami, Jacksonville and Cleveland.
25	Arizona Cardinals	Coach Bruce Arians on the game film after an ugly loss at Philadelphia: "It's not one you want to watch twice."
26	Cincinnati Bengals	The Bengals are the first team this season to score more than 17 points against the Bills.
27	Chicago Bears	QB Mitch Trubisky's debut was uninspiring, but he is hamstrung by inexperience and a lack of talent around him.
28	Indianapolis Colts	K Adam Vinatieri made 4 field goals to move into 2nd on the NFL's career list at 539; 26 behind Morten Andersen.
29	Los Angeles Chargers	If a team loses in a city where nobody pays attention, does it really happen?
30	New York Giants	The Giants fell to 0-5 for only the fifth time in franchise history.
31	San Francisco 49ers	The 49ers' last four losses have been by a combined 11 points.
32	Cleveland Browns	Coach Hue Jackson is 1-20 with the Browns.
